

PROMISE FULFILLED

PROMESA CUMPLIDA

Las lecturas de hoy nos hablan de la persona fiel, de aquella que espera en Dios pero tal vez no sienta su presencia. Toda persona que busca a Dios, en un momento u otro, experimenta la ausencia de Dios. El mismo Jesús gritó durante la noche oscura de su alma.

La epístola de Santiago hace referencia a esta cuestión. Dice que debemos ser tan pacientes como la tierra abandonada y silenciosa, que espera las lentas y húmedas lluvias del invierno y las fuertes y necesarias lluvias de la primavera. Al igual que el agricultor es consciente del precioso fruto de la tierra, también nosotros podemos ser conscientes de la valiosa cosecha de nuestra paciente espera. Dios nunca está lejos.

Los mensajeros de Juan Bautista preguntaron a Jesús si él era aquél que Juan había anunciado. Los mensajeros querían oír la respuesta que el encarcelado Juan ya sabía. Todo lo que Juan había dicho estaba finalmente aconteciendo: gracias a Jesús, la luz brilla en los ojos; las palabras de promesa son recibidas; la gente salta y baila.

La promesa de Isaías se cumple en Jesús. Rodillas inseguras y manos débiles se vuelven fuertes; el desierto estalla de vegetación; la sabana y la estepa florecen; la oscuridad es ahuyentada.

Third Sunday of Advent

Dark violet is used throughout Advent to express its character as a season of spiritual preparation for Christmas and "the coming of the Lord." But on the Third Sunday of Advent, formerly known as *Gaudete* (Latin for "rejoice") Sunday, rose may be added to the liturgical environment. The entire liturgy is infused with a spirit of rejoicing.

Today's first reading and Gospel proclaim the reality of God's saving work in our midst. Isaiah exuberantly describes the idyllic transformation of all creation as a result of God's presence in the midst of the people. In the Gospel, Jesus connects Isaiah's prophecy with what is happening in his own ministry. In addition to the list of healings from Isaiah (the blind, the lame, lepers, and the deaf), Jesus' presence brings two other reasons for rejoicing: "The dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them" (Matthew 11:5).

"REJOICE WITH JOYFUL SONG"

With almost childlike eagerness today's scriptures proclaim: "Here is your God...he comes to save you" (Isaiah 35:4); "the coming of the Lord is at hand" (James 5:8); "Are you the one who is to come?" (Matthew 11:3). Jesus' description of his ministry assures us that the Messiah has already come into the world to save humankind. And, after all, this is the reason we celebrate Christmas and "rejoice with joyful song" (Isaiah 35:2).

Yet we know that Isaiah's prophecy and Jesus' ministry of healing are not complete. Disease, poverty, sadness, and death are still rampant in our world, and much suffering is of human making. "The least" are not treated with the dignity that Jesus envisioned for them "in the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 11:11). The ministry described in these scriptures is still needed in the world today.

COME WISDOM, HOLY WORD OF GOD

One of the O Antiphons calls on Wisdom, the holy Word of God, to guide and show us the way to continue Jesus' healing, saving ministry. Today's scriptures provide a wealth of wisdom and a clear path for us to follow. God's wisdom is shown in Jesus, who has come into our midst to rescue the least ones and lift them out of their suffering. We have only to ask Jesus to heal our suffering and need, and show us the way to extend his salvation to others.

As you make your final preparations for Christmas, how will the wisdom of these scriptures affect your use of time and money? Will you purchase gifts for people who can't give back? Might you buy from an organization that supports people with disabilities? Will you write a letter to heal an old wound or rift? Where and with whom will you spend your time?
